Please keep wearing a face covering if you can

Although the legal requirement to wear a face covering in England ended on 19 July, the government expects and recommends that people continue to wear a face covering in crowded and enclosed spaces.

So we're encouraging you, to continue wearing face coverings if you can, until you are seated, once in your pew you are free to remove the mask if you wish. We ask that if you wish to remove your mask you sit near the front of the Abbey.

The area at the back of the abbey is for those who wish to be more socially distanced, we request that you keep masks on when seated here.

While the easing of restrictions means that some safety measures will no longer be a legal requirement, we've listened, and we know a lot of people remain cautious. In line with the government advice to act carefully, we feel it's important to continue with certain measures to be on the safe side.

We're keeping enhanced hygiene, cleaning and safety measures in place. As before, you'll find sanitiser at the Abbey entrance. Thank you for helping us all to look after each other, and stay safe.
